Preferring Advent

As a child, waiting for Christmas was almost unbearable—the anticipation of getting gifts, the magic of Christmas lights and dread of the words of “Santa Claus is Coming to Town.” The song still feels creepy, if not a bit threatening, as it talks about Santa watching us day and night to see if we are crying, pouting, bad or good. Luckily, I did not have a parent saying, “If you are not good you get nothing but coal in your stocking!”

Wonderfully, God is not like Santa Claus with a long list of the good or bad things that we have done. God’s gifts are not dependent on our goodness. God loves us so much that Jesus was sent to be Emmanuel, “God with Us.” The church season of Advent, the four weeks before Christmas, invites us to prepare for Jesus’ coming into our hearts and lives again. We get ready for Jesus, cleaning out space in our busy schedules to reflect on the best gift of all: God with us.

The celebration of Advent is out of sync with our culture’s emphasis on merriness and sparkling gifts and gadgets. The stores play “Have a Holly, Jolly Christmas.” We sing “O come, O come, Emmanuel and ransom captive Israel that mourns in lowly exile.” On the car radio, a country star sings “I Saw Mommy Kissing Santa Claus.” We prayerfully sing, “Come, Thou long-expected Jesus, born to set Thy people free. From our sins and fears release us, let us find our rest in Thee.” The acknowledgment of human pain and our trust in God in our Advent and Christmas hymns is richer, deeper, more meaningful and more honest than anything the secular world has to offer. I prefer Advent.

Worship during Advent helps us to look beyond the moment. We have an Advent wreath in the sanctuary, its circle of evergreens pointing to eternity and new life. We light four candles, symbolizing the hope, peace, and joy love that Christ brings. We light candles as the daylight lessens to remind us that Jesus is the light of the world, which darkness cannot overcome.

The richest blessings of Emmanuel, God with us, be upon us all,

Up Date from The Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC)



The PNC is pleased to report that the Ministry Information Form (MIF) has been submitted and approved by the Session and the Committee on Pastoral Transitions of Shenandoah Presbytery. The Ministry Information Form describes who we are as a church and is read by prospective candidates for the position of pastor. Writing the form has taken many weeks. It is hard to describe our church's life and mission in a very limited number of words. Currently, the Pastor Nominating Committee is in the process of reviewing the Personal Information Forms of pastors. We have been meeting weekly, reflecting on scripture and praying for God's leading in each step of this process. We have enjoyed working together, which is a great blessing in what is necessarily a long process.

SESSION HIGHLIGHTS

The Session met on Sunday, October 28, 2018.

The following is a brief summary of some of the business discussed:

- Welcomed Bob Simmons from the Diaconate Prayer Ministry. Session accepted the recommendation from the Prayer Ministry to pair up and pray for one another and our church no less than once per week.
- Approved the Ministry Information Form as prepared by the Pastor Nominating Committee and presented by the PNC's chair, Steve Mason. This is the form that prospective pastors will see, and was approved by Presbytery.
- Joyfully acknowledged the birth of Hayes Alan Thompson, son of Devon and Katie Y. Thompson on October 15, 2018.
- Approved the baptism of Taylor Marie Houff, daughter of Justin and Laura G. Houff, for December 23, 2018
- Welcomed home Debra Fitzgerald O'Connell as she reunites her membership after being at Fairfax Pres. since 1989.
- Transferred the membership of Helen Gardner to the Church Triumphant upon her death on October 10, 2018.
- Acknowledged the deaths of former members Cookie Kosak and Lewis Davis, Jr.
- Transferred the membership of Tom and Alice Reider to Hope Community Church.
- Were apprised that Brian Otto, director of the Preschool will have his last day here on November 9, and Mrs. Denise Stewart will serve as the interim director.
- Adult and Children's Christian Education ministry will present a revised Child and Youth Protection policy to the Session on December 2.
- The next meeting of the Presbytery is November 27 in Strasburg, Va.
- Over 200 youth and adults attended our Trunk or Treat.
- Session approved the document created by the Congregational Care Ministry for reviewing and updating our church membership rolls.
- The Finance Ministry asks all chairpersons to have their 2019 budget requests in by November 15.
- All officers have been reminded to take the lead in Stewardship tithing and have their pledge cards turned in by the end of October.
- Approved the paid holiday schedule for staff in 2019.
- Received as information from the Personnel Committee the dates for interim pastor, Rosalind Banbury, vacation and continuing education through the end of 2018.
- Extended contract of Rosalind Banbury through June 8, 2019, and can be reviewed to accommodate the PNC process.
- The trustees announced a tentative contract with Stonewall Garden Apartments, LLC to purchase Massanetta Cottage.
- Upon request from the Congregational Nominating Committee (CNC), approved a congregational meeting for November 18 for the election of the 2021 classes of elders, deacons, and trustees.
- Session tabled a vote on the recommendation from the CNC to reduce our officers size to 9 elders and 9 deacons.
- Approved December 2, for our Joint Officers meeting with individual Diaconate and Session meetings to follow that same evening.

EARLY CHILDHOOD LEARNING CENTER MINISTRY

Quality Preschool Education for 2 - 4 Year-Olds

We are sad to announce that Brian Otto has resigned his position as Director of our Early Childhood Learning Center (ECLC); November 9th was his last day with us. His wife left her job in early October for personal reasons, and this put his family in a situation where they no longer had health insurance and other benefits. He needed a full-time position that carries benefits. We are happy to say prayers were answered as he has been hired with a non-profit organization in Charlottesville called ReadyKids that provides training to childcare centers associated with the Virginia Quality Rating and Improvement System. We appreciate the five years of service he has given to the ECLC as Lead Teacher, Interim Director, and Director. He will be greatly missed by the ministry team, staff, and students.

The Lord works in wonderful ways as we are able to move Denise Stewart, a Teaching Assistant at the ECLC for the last three years, into the role of Interim Director/Lead Teacher in the four-year-old class. Mrs. Stewart has a Child Development Associate (CDA) Credential and twenty years of experience in education. Previously, she managed her own daycare center and was employed as the director of the Augusta County Parks and Recreation afterschool program. Mrs. Stewart has been married for 15 years, is the mother of five, and recently became a grandmother. She and Mr. Otto have had the benefit of a transition period, and we are excited to see where her leadership takes the ECLC.



Clean-Up Buckets Needed for Hurricane Florence Victims Sponsored by TSPC Mission Ministry

Shenandoah Presbytery is collecting Church World Service (CWS) **Clean-Up Buckets** to be sent to North and South Carolina for Hurricane Florence victims. Empty buckets are available for purchase at Lowes and Home Depot stores and most supplies can be found at the Dollar Store. Please place filled buckets under or near the mission table located in the coffee area outside the sanctuary the week of Sunday, December 2 – Sunday, December 9. For questions, please contact Bob Kuykendall at 540-241-9952.

Supplies Needed for Emergency Cleanup Buckets :

- One five-gallon bucket with resealable lid (If bucket has been used, clean well but do not use if it has held chemicals of any kind.)
- Four scouring pads
- Seven sponges, including one large
- One scrub brush
- Eighteen reusable cleaning towels (e.g. Easy Wipes)
- One 50 oz. or two 25 oz. bottle(s) of liquid laundry detergent
- One 16-28 oz. bottle of liquid disinfectant dish soap
- One 12-16 oz. bottle of household cleaner that can be mixed with water (no spray bottles)
- One package of 48-50 clothespins
- Clothesline, two 50 ft. or one 100 ft.
- Five dust masks
- Two pairs non surgical latex gloves
- One pair work gloves, cotton with leather palm or all leather
- 24-28 heavy duty or contractor type 30-45 gallon trash bags on a roll and removed from carton
- One 6-9 oz. bottle of non-aerosol insect repellent

All cleaning items must be new, all liquid items must be capped and securely tightened. Place all items into the bucket, making sure they are packed securely to avoid damage during shipment. Snap the lid on tight and seal with packing tape.
